Free Summer Meals Available

Bedford County Public Schools will utilize the USDA Summer Food Service Program to provide a “Grab N-Go” curbside meal pickup option for the community during the summer. Breakfast and lunch will be available to all children 18 & under regardless of income level beginning Monday, June 7, 2021 through Thursday, July 29, 2021.

Meals will be available for pick up Monday through Thursday at the locations and times listed below. When families pick up lunch, they will also receive a breakfast for the next morning. Families will receive meals for Friday when they pick up meals on Thursday. **All locations will be closed on Friday.**

Meals are available to all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

Goodview Elementary 11:15 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. Cafeteria entrance located in front of the school building

Montvale Elementary 11:00 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. Cafeteria door located in front circle of the school building

New London Academy 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Bus drop off entrance located at the back of the school building

Thomas Jefferson Elementary 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Cafeteria entrance located in front of the building
